## a new shelter for San Francisco

Building a sustainable future for the City's homeless, injured, lost, and abandoned domestic and wild animals.

San Francisco Animal Care & Control's current facility at 1200 15th Street was originally built as a warehouse in 1931 and renovated into an animal shelter in 1989. Since then, the standards for animal care and the number of animals we serve have changed dramatically, leaving our current facility woefully inadequate.

### THE PLAN

It's time to leave our seismically unsound, cramped, and unsafe building. We need a new home. The lack of seismic safety in our shelter endangers the animals in our care and the people who care for them. The building could crumble in an earthquake, and we would not be able to fulfill our duty as first responders in a disaster.

Our new shelter will be a state-of-the-art, retrofitted historic building with modernized facilities. Constructed in 1893 and rich in San Francisco history, the building located on the northeast corner of Bryant and Alameda Streets is one of the city's few remaining unreinforced masonry buildings of its time, and it will be preserved for all San Franciscans to visit and enjoy. It will allow us to follow best practices in disease, noise, and odor control, thereby improving the overall well-being and adoptability of the animals in our care. In addition, the new shelter will:

- Meet seismic code to operate in emergencies
- Nearly double in size and space
- Increase the number of play yards for dogs and small animals from one to four
- Offer plenty of indoor room for kittens and cats
- Include conference rooms and open spaces for meetings, trainings, and children's camps
- Have improved ventilation and air-conditioning systems that will enable us to provide enclosed isolation rooms for animals with contagious illnesses







