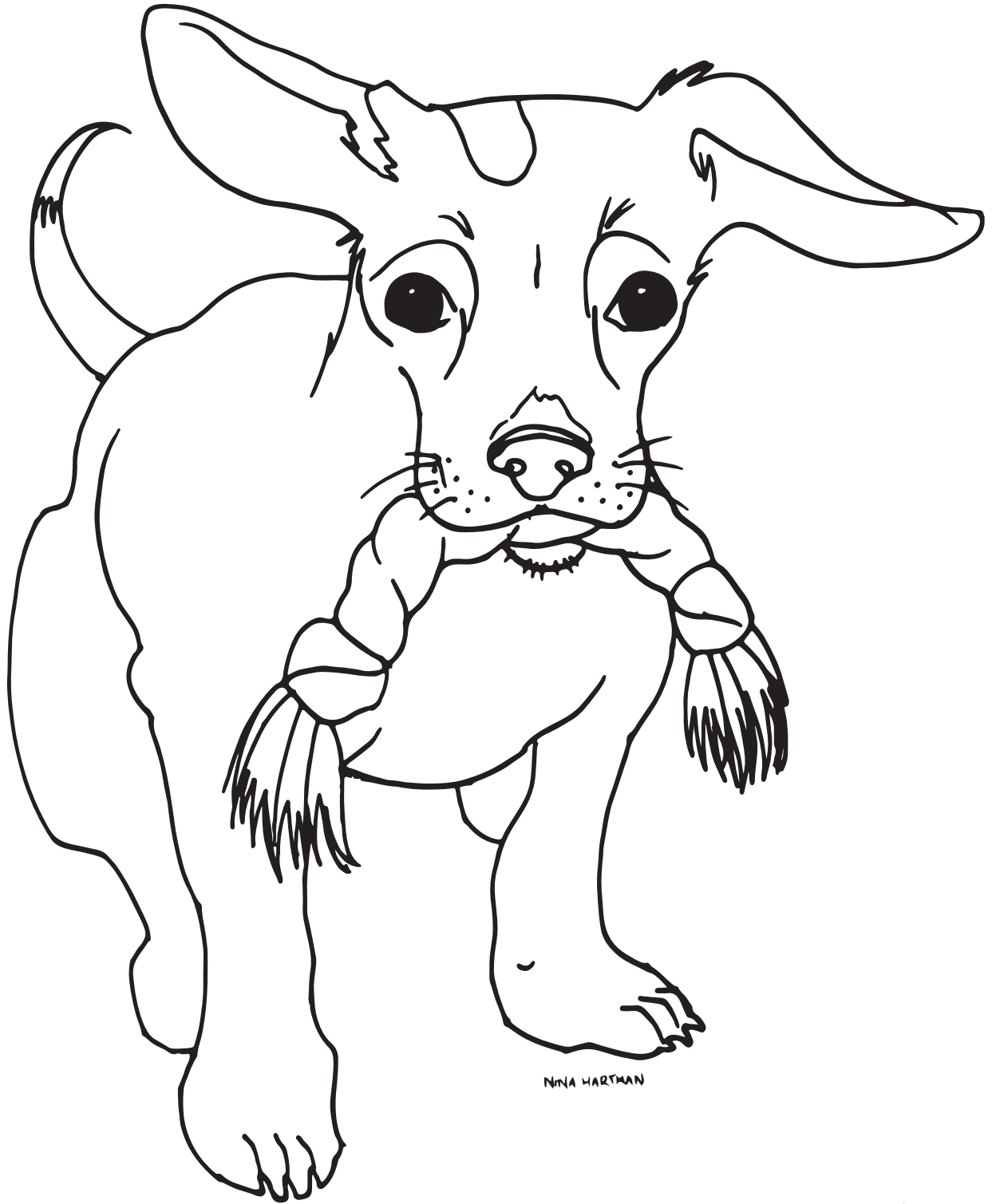

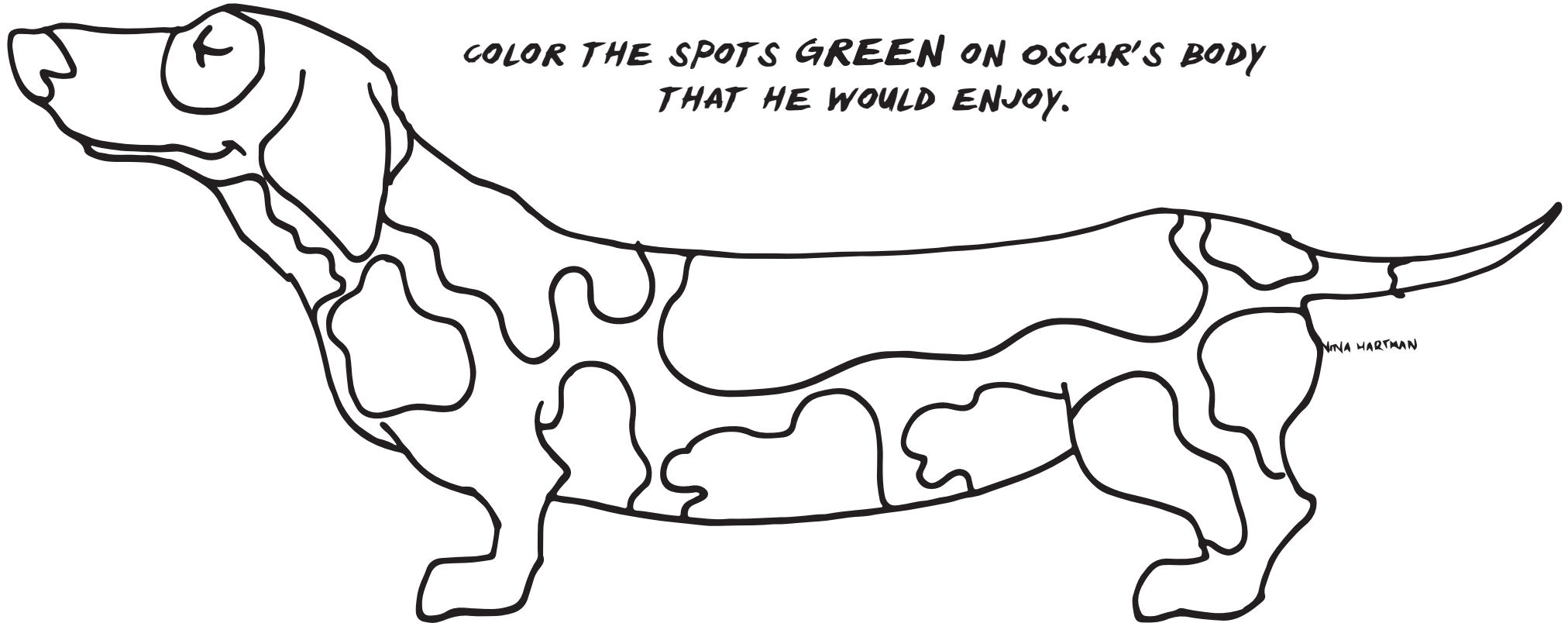


DOGS LOVE TO SNIFF! IT'S HOW THEY GET TO KNOW

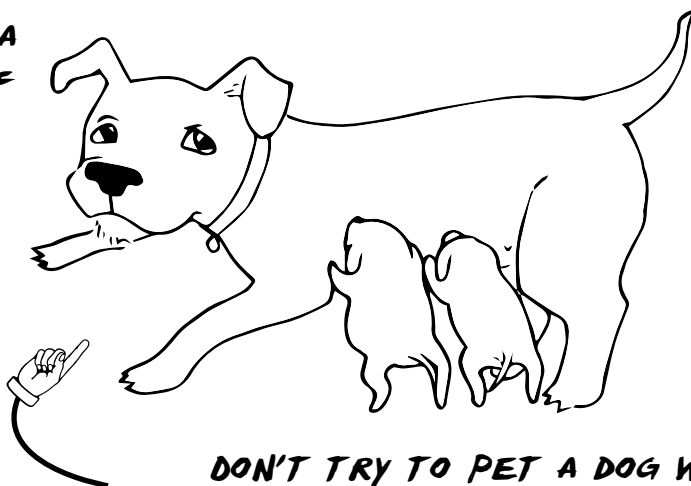

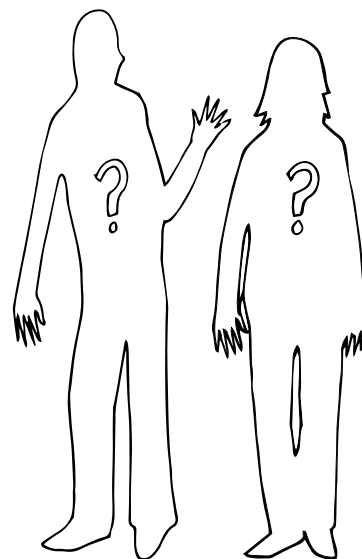
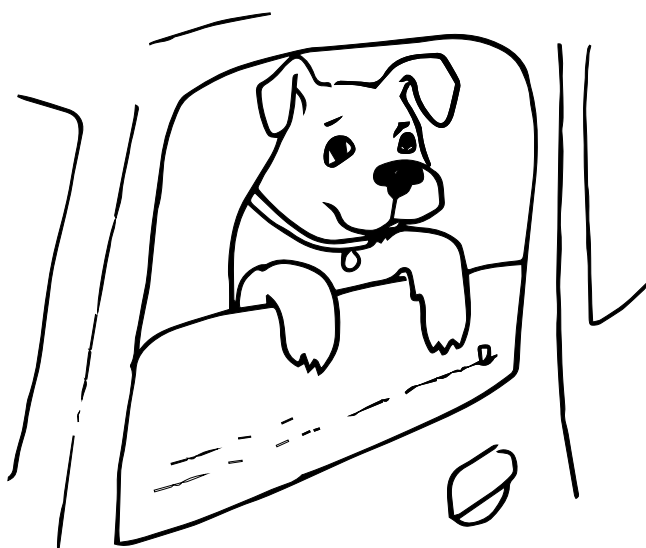
GIVE DOGS WHO ARE EATING A MEAL OR A TREAT PLENTY OF SPACE.



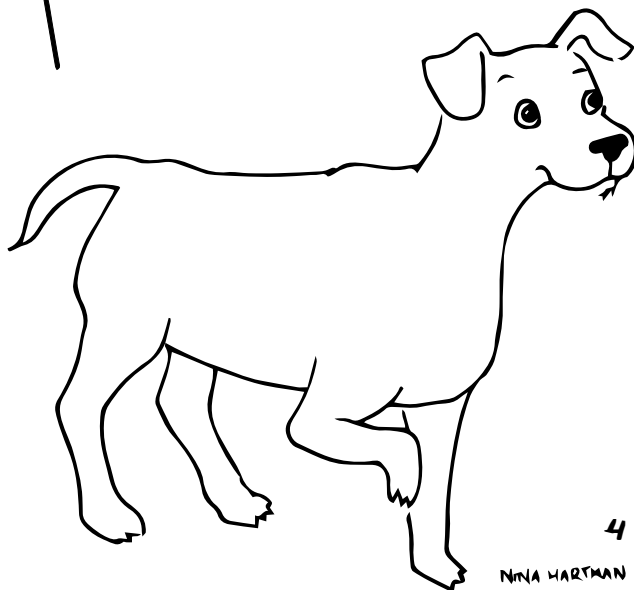
DON'T TRY TO PET A DOG WHO IS NURSING PUPPIES. SHE MIGHT THINK YOU'RE A THREAT.

DOGS WAITING IN CARS OR YARDS MAY BE GUARDING THEIR SPACE. WAVE HELLO, BUT STAY AWAY.

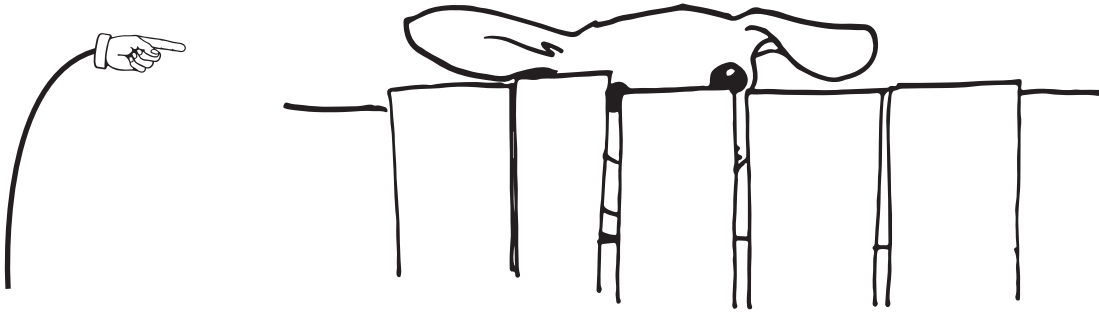

DO YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO IF A LOOSE DOG APPROACHES YOU?

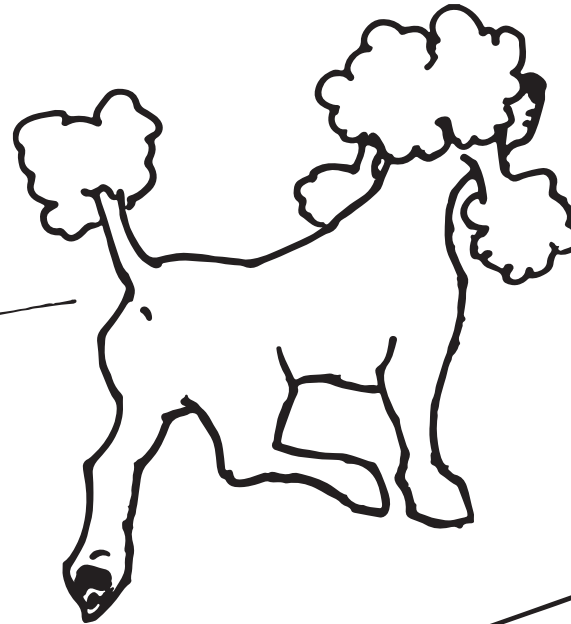

GET BORED QUICKLY!

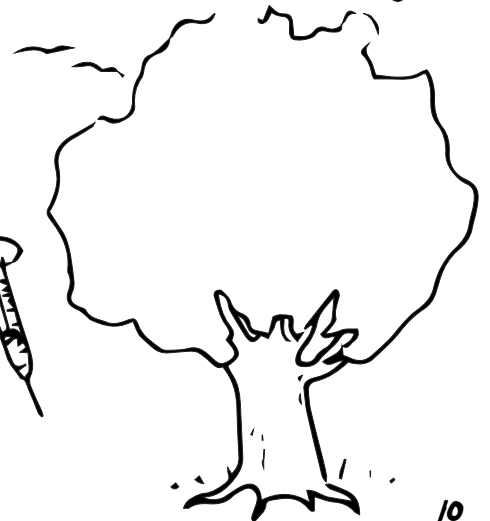
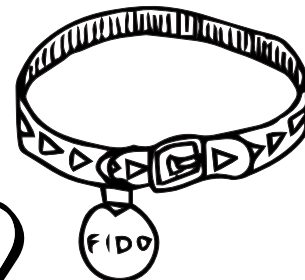
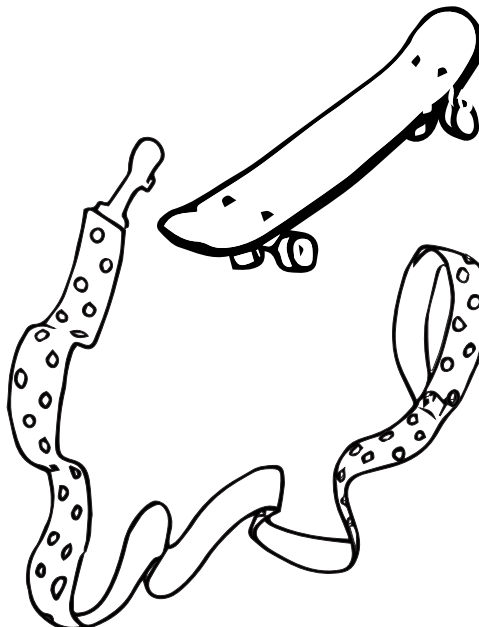
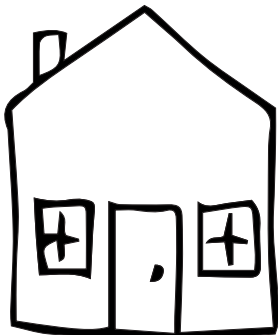
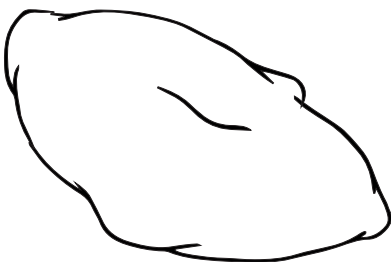
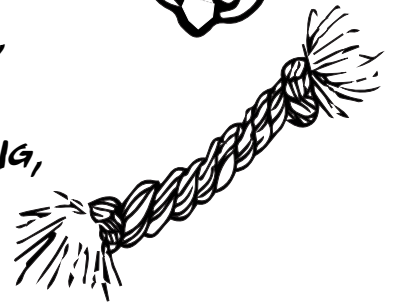

VISIT YOUR LOCAL ANIMAL SHELTER OR RESCUE GROUP TO SAVE THE LIFE OF A HOMELESS ANIMAL, AND HELP PREVENT OVERPOPULATION!

THE SAN FRANCISCO DEPARTMENT OF ANIMAL CARE & CONTROL (SFACC) IS A TAXPAYER-FUNDED, OPEN-ADMISSION ANIMAL SHELTER. SINCE 1989, SFACC HAS PROVIDED HOUSING, CARE, AND MEDICAL TREATMENT TO WILD, EXOTIC AND DOMESTIC STRAY, LOST, ABANDONED, SICK, INJURED, AND SURRENDERED ANIMALS. SFACC'S DOORS ARE OPEN TO ALL ANIMALS IN NEED REGARDLESS OF SPECIES, MEDICAL, OR BEHAVIORAL CONDITION.



SFANIMAL CARE & CONTROL

WE SHELTER HOMELESS, NEGLECTED, AND ABUSED ANIMALS AND PROVIDE HUMANE EDUCATION AND MANY OTHER SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY.

WE ARE THE LOCAL AGENCY TO CALL TO INVESTIGATE ANIMAL CRUELTY, ABUSE OR NEGLECT, RESCUE WILDLIFE IN DISTRESS, AND AID DOMESTIC ANIMALS WHO NEED US.

SFACC AIMS TO ADOPT, REHOME, OR REUNITE DOMESTIC ANIMALS WITH THEIR GUARDIANS AND RELEASE WILDLIFE TO THEIR NATIVE HABITAT.
